A range of cast name, number plates and signs for engines, roads and lineside details. This list is in three sections.

The pricing is a variable of the number of plates within one set, whether this is for one engine or for lineside uses such as signal cabin name plates or railway warning signs. This range is being expanded in stages.

Introduction on engine name or number plates

These are mainly for industrial engines, although some smokebox plates, makers and tender capacity plates will also be introduced.

Perhaps as many as half the number of industrial railway engines carried name or number plates. It appears as a rule of thumb different engine manufacturers used their own style, although over time that style may be varied. Owners of large fleets of locomotives may use a common house style for name or number plates which could vary from that normally used by the maker. However it was not uncommon that nameplates would be moved from engine to engine or be duplicated by different owners, so it is best to refer to a specific locomotive by the makers work order book reference than any label used by the owner at a specific time.

The list is as best as we can produce from available evidence but it may contain errors.

Not all industrial engines carried nameplates. In more recent times names could be transfers or painted on - for example many Andrew Barclays usually used transfers, many Hunslet design18" 0-6-0STs known as Austerities, whilst others - for example the National Coal Board (NCB) often dispensed with names altogether using just numbers when they acquired new engines - i.e. at sometime after 1947.

Preparation


Most engine plates are brass, whereas other plates could be painted cast iron or use add on cut out letters fixed down sometimes to a wood base.

Clean up the edges and remove the joining tabs. If it is a painted plate, first paint the whole plate

and when dry repaint with the background colour wiping it from the raised sections before the paint dries. Alternatively you may be able to flood fill the background colour with a very runny paint mixture.

If a brass plate you may embolden the raised section by polishing the face. The background colour may be made by either felt tip pen or paint.

As the normal material used is 010" brass, if this is too thick the rear of the plate may be thinned. A few plates had inset lettering (black) in a polished brass. Some manufacturers were known to use cast iron for their plates this will be represented in nickel-silver.



Road Name Plates

These name plates are in brass and are supplied in two styles:

A serif letter style with a champhered boarder

A plain letter style - marked (P) in the list

They are supplied in themes:

 Railway, Nautical, Trades, Agricultural, Regal, Heroic, Geography, Shires, Place, Corporation, Navigation and Mediaeval

We will never be able to reproduce all street names - there would be thousands on the list. Each theme has different numbers of names, and only one copy of each name. Use of more modern nameing conventions is avoided such as Close, Avenue. The range concentrates on what was generally ubiqutous in the Victorian era as railways were being built, so it does not use very local/regional name themes. It should be noted however that the Shire and Place themes could apply to a very wide area - such as London Road which could be many miles from London as the road leads towards the place named, it does not necessarily lie within a location boundary.

It might be possible to "cut and shut" these plaques together if a required combination could be made from them.

Please note in some instances Terrace is trucated to Ter and Street to St.

In most instances the lettering and boundry would be black and the background coloured white.



Lineside Etched Plates

This section includes cast plates used on station platforms for offices and bridges or subways, signal box name plates and other lineside notices.

The platform signs are in a Victorian style as seen used by L&YR and other companies. The illustration is based upn a sign used at Totely Station (Midland Railway)

It is usually recorded the platform lettering was white and the background black, but this may also have been dark blue.

Warning signs were coloured with a variety of background colours from black or blue to red/oxide.

· Bridge Signs Set

Way Out with pointing hand signs and passengers must cross the line by the bridge - in several formats. The bridge signs were often fixed over or adjacent to the bridge steps.

· Subway Signs Set

Way Out and Way In signs plus passengers must cross the line by the subway - in two formats

· Platform Office Signs Set

Usually fitted under canopies usually they are double sided and are placed at right angles to the offices they refer:

Station Master Office, Telegraph Office, Ladies Room, Gentlemen, Booking Hall, Ticket Office, General Office, Refreshment Rooms, Ladies Room - First Class, Parcels Office, Dining Room

· Platform Door Signs Set

Very small signs for fixing to doors. These are :

Private, Porters, Station Master, Telegraph, Ladies Room, Gentlemen, Parcels Office, Stores

- Warning Notices
 - 1. Beware of Trains & No Admittance signs are included with the 6 inch letters set for signal box or other names.
 - 2. "Engines must not pass this board"
 - 3. A large "SWITCH" sign used to mark the location of catch points.










Signal Box Name Boards

A limited range using the Midland Railway style of lettering for Settle and Carlisle Railway signal boxes. These use the general wider spacing of the Midland Railway, but we have no proof these would be correct for every box. This general style was retained by the LMS but with a narrower letter spacing and shorter name board, but one sign was usually put at each end of the signal box, making it likely the two nameboards would be different i.e. one MR and LMS sign per box. Not all signal boxes were so treated.

Initially these signal box name boards were produced to compliment the building windows for stations and goods sheds etches of the Settle & Carlisle railway line. They are:-



Dent (including the LMS narrower spacing letters), Dent Head, Ais Gill, Garsdale, Blea Moor, Horton Calgaith, New Beggin, Mallerstang, Ribblehead, Long Meg, Ormside, Earby Crossing, Earby Station, Settle North Junction, Settle South Junction, Hellifield, Grassington, Selside, Bell Box, Appleby, Helwith Bridge, Skipton North Junction, Hellifield South Junction, Hellified North Junction.

Those stations with goods sheds were: Appleby, Kirkby Stephen West, Crosby Garrett, Settle, Hawes, Armawathwaite, Long Marton, Lazonby, Langwathby.

Another range - from the iconic Peak District lines includes place names - some of which were signal cabins. These are Bakewell, Bugsworth and Buxworth, Buxton, Chap-en-le-Frith, Darley Dale, Chinley, Great Longstone, Cromford, Gowhole, Haddon, Hassop, Matlock, Millers Dale, Mosal Dale, New Mills, Peak Forest, Rowsley, Tideswell and Whatstandwell.

AMBIS can also supply blank name boards and 6 inch lettering to enable other names to be created.

New Signal box nameplates derrived from the Tiviot Dale project became available during 2016. There are two spellings of Tiviot or Teviot Date that were used and in later days the signal box was simply named "Stockport", although there were other lines through Stockport.




Note the change of etter style of "O" and "D" - the west signal box was closed c.1930 and hence only has the earlier style lettering.

• Mile Posts and Bridge Numbers(Midland Railway style) - product LS11

These are available on three etchings. The plates include quarter, half and three quarter mile signs. All will need a post, usually worn bullhead rail would be used - the shape being an equal "dumb bell" whereas new rail has a deeper head - so file away the top of a rail unitl it matches the lower section profile.

The mile post signs of set one are 0,5,10,15,20,25,30,40,45,50,55,60,65,70,75,80,85,90,95,100,103,105,107,108,110,120,125 and 102 and 105 in quarter mile posts




The mile post signs of set two are 0,1,2,3,4,6,31,36,41,46,51,56,61,66,71,76,81,86,91,96,101,102,106,109,111,112,124,126,127 and 104 and 107 in quarter mile posts

The mile post signs of set three are 0,11,12,14,16,18,32,37,42,47,52,57,62,67,72,77,82,87,92,97,122,127,128,131,132,133,134,136,137 and 106 and 109 in quarter mile posts

Normally these moleages are measured from St Pancras in London and starting at the junction "0" on branch lines which had their own distance posts, The fractional mile posts need to be folded up and the mile post signs will need folding into a "V" shape.

"SWITCH" was a sign used to identify pointwork when running against the normal direction, most often to indicate the presence of a catch point.



A supplement for Settle & Carlisle line fans now includes milepost 240 to 260 inclusive.

Bridge number plates would be added to a structure (including foot bridges) that crossed over or dived under a railway. Please use photographs to aid locating, although no fixed rule appears to apply they can be seen at around 6-9ft high on the down line approach side or attached to railings on underbridges. New structures on a line would acquire a suffix number (letter) so not create a


replacement programme renumbering exisitng structures. We have added "1A", "1B","2A", "2B", "3A", "4A", "5A", "6A", "7A", "8A", "9A" to whole numers.

A similar range of bridge number plates using the former LN&WR style, lettered "LMS" is also available - from 1 to 99 include some A suffix numbers.

There is no doubt this will not suit all requirements, special runs with other numbers may be commissioned.

Wagon Plates

There is a limited range of cast wagon number plates available, primarily for the Midland Railway and its successor the LMS.



These number plates started as rectangular items but changed to a half oval pattern about 1918. The LMS continued this practice substituting LMS for MIDLAND. From 1948 the "L" and "S" was blackened showing only the "M" prefix for the wagon number on LMS wagons - none or very few MR wagons still existed in running order that show how BR managed the MR plates.

In 1928 wagons capable of running in passenger trains were re-branded and re-numbered, though there is no evidence of cast wagon number plates were retained on these wagons. This primarily affected the MCV class of Midland wagons.

A reference sheet of known wagons by type is included with each series of etchings. These are being marketed in

groups - open wagons, vans, brake vans and special wagons, "oval" plates, earler style plates with larger numbers and a limited number of LMS built wagons to Midland Railway diagrams.

Although railways tended to paint the wagon number on the body of the wagon, earlier MR wagons do not appear to have any branding or painted on wagon number, the Midland Railway used only the cast number plate. Some earlier examples show different size letters/numerals were used and the word "brake" used later was not initially applied to the number plate. Some railways notably the S&DJR and CLC also used the same style number plate as the MR - possibly because the MR built those wagons.



The L&YR "load to be evenly distributed" sign has been re-mastered in a thinner material and is now more or less legible.



"FRUIT" and "FISH" plates used by the LNER to designate those wagons for special use.
